Human Rights and Citizenship is a research group in Law, investigating new technologies and solutions for developing and implementing an innovative model of Smart Cities, called Smart Restorative Cities, understood as those that integrate the precepts of Smart Cities and Restorative Cities with the purpose of creating a link between innovation and social peace. It contribute to expand knowledge of the area through publications, participation in events of national and international relevance as well as in partnership with Itapema city, acting to jointly research for practical solutions aimed at improving the quality of life of citizens through the implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals, 11 and 16, which aim respectively to make cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable, and also to promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all and build effective accountable and inclusive institutions at all levels of society.

Human Rights and Citizenship researchers, investigate state-of-the-art technologies and their use to solve real-life problems. Research models and projects are carried out in cooperation with research groups from Brazil and Europe.
